Greetings from Pastor Sam

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Life is change. When there are children at home, the start of every public school year is filled with meeting new teachers, perhaps changing schools, new forms to fill out, and what clothes to buy. Those who home school or have their kids in church schools likewise deal with a raft of changes each year. Even if you have no children or if they have left the nest empty, this time of year is filled with indelible memories. Just last night, I dreamed, first, I was at the beginning of a high school year and, then, at the beginning of my last year of seminary. Long ago, churches recognized that parish life is ordered around the school year when it comes to its programs (education, youth, music, etc.). We begin anew each fall.

The baptized life is change. Day by day, we return to our Baptism confessing our sins and our need for our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. Whether standing in the shower or immersed in a tub, it helps to ask and answer the questions of the baptismal rite: “Do you renounce the devil? I do. Do you renounce his works? I do. Do you renounce his ways? I do. Do you believe in God the Father? I believe.... Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe.... Do you believe in the Holy Spirit? I believe....”

Change is difficult, because we are all homeostasis-seeking creatures, which means we want things to stay the same... often even when the same is unhealthy, dysfunctional, and even miserable. We tell ourselves, “It’s too hard to change,” which means “I don’t want to change, because it’s frightening; people won’t like me; I won’t be able to cope.” Addicts often go to rehab multiple times. Each failure reinforces that “I can’t change.” Our Lord Jesus tells us who is behind that: “The thief comes to steal, kill, and destroy” (John 10:10). Even if you don’t wrestle with that kind of addiction, you understand.

Change is difficult, because it is, well, change. People often get baptized as older youth or adults, and, within weeks or months, they return to the old ways, because they start taking grief from family or friends who do not practice the Christian faith. My confirmation pastor used to tell about the woman who griped that her husband was a drunk. Then, when he went to AA, she rejoiced until she saw how often he went to meetings. She said, “I liked you better when you were drinking.” Our standing relationships are often detrimental to change. They prefer that we not change. We can easily give in. I’m singing under my breath an old Beatles’ song: “Get back to where you once belonged.” Change is hard!

The psalmist says: “Seven times a day I praise you...” (119:164). The early monastics known as the desert fathers ordered their lives around praying seven times a day. Houses of prayer (monks and nuns) still so order their days. When I go to quarterly retreats, we pray together seven times in a 24-hour period. The idea is to reinforce and undergird a pastor’s life of prayer, but, then, we go home to busy, busy lives.

Life is change, and, as your pastor, I am charged to remind you who and Whose you are day by day. If you pray and read the Bible daily, it’s more difficult not to worship weekly. If you worship weekly, it’s easier to get yourself (and, for some of us, our kids) to Sunday school. If you receive Jesus in His holy meal, He goes with you into daily life and work. It’s easier to make and keep spiritual friendships in which you both grow and more consciously see your life as service and as a steward of God’s things!

Life is change, day by day, until we draw our last breath. Then, the child of God is wholly His! Remember who and Whose you are. Pray daily. Worship weekly. Read *and study* the Bible. Just show up this week!

At the regular Council meeting, the following was approved:

- Labor, materials, and permit charges of \$1,945.92 for the replacement of the water heater is to be paid out of the Contingency Fund (2-810550).
- The call from Council was extended to Kristine Regalado to be the St. Matthew's Director of Youth and Family Ministries.
- Council approved the sale of alcohol at the Christkindlmarkt festival on November 22, 2025, and at the "day after sale" on November 23, 2025.
- Approved Thompson, Price, Scott, Adams & Co, P.A. as the accounting firm, and to prepare a Compilation Report at the cost of \$4,500, subject to confirmation that a compilation report is acceptable to the bank.

Cashiers	• Arrive by 9:00 a.m. Report to the Finance Office. Collect money boxes. Accept cash, charge cards, debit cards and checks (made payable to St. Matthew’s Lutheran Church) if you know the customer.
Greeters	• Be at your posts by 9:30 to welcome visitors. Say, “Hi. Welcome to St. Matthew’s.” Encourage donations and offer a gift for donation.
Runners	• Rotate among four food and pretzel stations to ensure supply of chips, pretzels, sodas, potato salad, sauerkraut, etc.
Clean-up Crew	• Take down and store tents, cones, signs, grills • Gather and store chairs • Put away food and beverages in proper storage area • Wash and put away other equipment • Box and label left-over inventory for next year and store in cage • Take down decorations (as needed) and store in cage
