LENTEN PRAYER RETREAT - SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 21, 2026

Professor John Pless, Assistant Professor of Pastoral Ministry and Missions at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana, will be our guest teacher and preacher for the first weekend in Lent on February 21-22. His topic for the retreat is "Wilhelm Loehe: Visionary Pastor." Professor Pless will present especially on Loehe's care of souls as he guided lives of prayer and service to neighbor. We will apply for major funding for the Lenten Prayer Retreat to be provided by a grant from the St. Matthew's Endowment Fund. Greetings from Pastor Sam

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The first half of February, we are in ordinary time (numbered Sundays after the Epiphany) which concludes with the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ on February 14-15. On that weekend, we sing our last “alleluias” until the Easter Vigil on April 4. The time before Lent concludes with two wrap-around events: a youth-sponsored Valentine’s dance and taco bar for all ages on Friday, February 13 and the annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper on February 17.

The forty days of Lent begin at noon and 7 p.m. on Ash Wednesday, February 18, the most solemn day of the liturgical year when we make a soul-searching confession of sins and have ashes imposed on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. The clergy declare at the imposition of ashes: “Remember, O man (woman), you are dust and to dust you shall return.” Lent is a season of baptismal renewal and a season of preparing candidates for Holy Baptism at Easter. Remember the Sundays are *in* Lent and not *of* Lent.

During the season of Lent, we make palpable signs of repentance by setting aside some favorite crutch (a God substitute such as that favorite beverage or that digital tether in your hand or at your ear) or by beginning some new edifying discipline (more frequent worship, daily devotions, physical exercise, more family time). These things are not prescriptive or imposed by the pastor as if these disciplines merit anything. In this life, we remain poor, miserable sinners, who always fall empty-handed before the only One who can save and redeem us, the Lord Jesus Christ. Nevertheless, we remember our Lord’s words from His sermon on the mount in Matthew 6: “Lay not up for yourselves treasures on earth where rust and moth consume and thieves break in and steal.”

Martin Luther and the Lutheran reformers did not abandon the ancient practice of private confession. In his Large Catechism, Luther makes clear that if every Christian understood what a gift it is to be freed from the guilt or shame that has bound and tormented one’s conscience perhaps for years, he or she would run one hundred miles and demand a pastor to hear his or her confession that the Lord’s absolution might comfort them at last.

Each quarter of the year, I go on retreat where I avail myself of the opportunity to confess my sins in a confidential setting with a pastor and hear God’s forgiveness for that which has troubled my conscience. I commend the practice to all of you and not for my sake but for yours. I have far too many sins of my own to spend time remembering or holding on to yours, but, I am certain that any one of our retired pastors would gladly hear your confession by appointment. The rite for Individual Confession and Forgiveness may be found and reviewed on pp. 196-197 in the front of the Lutheran Book of Worship.

I treasure being your pastor and look forward to pastoral conversations with you as you so desire. Do remember that, while God knows everything, I only know what you tell me. Please keep a holy Lent.

Church Council

At the regular Council meeting, the following was approved:

- In accordance with the requirements of the church constitution the following appointments were approved: Jon Lindsay as Assistant Treasurer; Darlene Schucker as Parish Records Secretary; Cooper Ullring as Recording Secretary; Becky Howard and Mike Harrington to the Nominating Team; Darlene Schucker (3-year term) to the Parish Records Audit Team; Pr. Joel Kettner (2-year term) to the Seminary Scholarship Team; Joyce Crouch (3-year term) to the Financial Audit Team; AJ Hemphill and Arthur Yankasky (3-year terms) to the Pastoral Support Team; and Al Glaeser and Loni Beuerman (2-year terms) to the Long-Range Planning Team.
- It was approved to transfer \$50,000 from the First Bank Money Market account into the Thrivent CFW Bond Fund to take advantage of greater yields.
- An inflation adjustment was approved to The Children's Schoolhouse lease, from \$380 to \$387.50 per month.
- The 2026 CKM cash flow was approved as this year's business/operating budget for the 2026 festival (target income is \$60,075).
- The Continuing Resolution for the Financial Audit Team was amended to delete the current Duties and Responsibilities number 3 that refers to the ELCA Congregational Audit Guide and adjust other language to bring it into compliance with current language in the church's 21 September 2025 constitution.
- It was approved to pay Wells Insurance Company the full annual premium of not-to-exceed \$56,374.76 for Property/Casualty/Liability Insurance in total to save the 12% financing charge.
- A discussion initiated by Pastor Zumwalt concerning the establishment of a call committee in anticipation of seeking a candidate to fill an associate pastor position approved by the congregation during the 2026 budget process. To begin the process of identifying St. Matthew's members to sit on the call committee, council members were requested to suggest potential candidates at the next council meeting in February. After the council identifies potential call committee candidates and in accordance with paragraph C09.01 of the church constitution, a congregation meeting will be called to elect the call committee members.
- A proposal for a new ministry team to be established to address current-day security issues facing church congregations. The council agreed to move forward with this initiative and Dave Sundberg will prepare a continuing resolution establishing this ministry team.

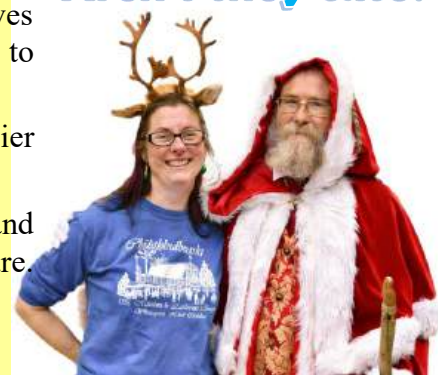
