Greetings from Pastor Sam

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Thank you for the four-week sabbatical, my first in forty-years as a pastor. I am not on vacation during this time. I will be regularly in touch for administrative and pastoral concerns, but Pastor Shivers and Pastor Bergbower will provide the preaching, worship leadership, and on-call for emergencies coverage for the weeks leading up to July 19 and 26 and August 2 and 9. I will be back in the pulpit on August 16.

During these weeks, I am working on a project related to outreach to our wider area. Because we are the only confessional Lutheran congregation in the area, we have both an opportunity and responsibility to become more visible and accessible to a greater number of households. St. Matthew's has offered excellent resources for growth in faith and life for decades, but we have often hidden our light under a bushel. With Pastor Shivers now in the role of Associate Pastor and focused on increasing involvement, also with the help of Casey Bartholomew our Parish Involvement Intern, we want to encourage more of our members to participate actively in our life together and service to our community.

This year, Rally Day is August 30, the Feast of the Martyrdom of St. John the Baptist, an important day in the liturgical year that reminds us of the cost of discipleship. The fall Sunday School classes will begin two weeks later on September 13 at 9:45 a.m. My Adult Catechism Class in McCombs Fellowship Hall will be a deep dive into Luther's Small Catechism as an accurate exposition of what the Bible teaches. If you are new to St. Matthew's, you should attend this class especially if you want to join our parish on December 6. A free copy of Luther's Small Catechism and Explanation will be provided. If you are a long-time Lutheran but haven't been to catechism instruction in years, I do encourage you to register for this class and to purchase a copy of the **2017 Edition of Luther's Small Catechism and Explanation** from Concordia Publishing House. You can purchase it at amazon.com or cph.org.

On July 1, I began my twenty-third year as St. Matthew's Senior Pastor. Administrative Assistant Donna Capozio began her eighteenth year of service. Bill Glisson is in his twenty-third year as organist. Length of service by key staff provides stability, but we are also grateful for all the other staff members, older and newer, whose gifts and talents provide depth and energy to our life together. Do not weary in well-doing, dear ones. Pray daily. Worship weekly. Read the Bible. Serve at and beyond St. Matthew's. Be in relationship to encourage spiritual growth in others. Give generously of time, talent, and resources.

Church Council

For the month of July, Council approved the following:

- The purchase of a computer for Deacon Robert in the not-to-exceed amount of \$1,500.
- AJ Hemphill and Patty Hemphill were appointed as members of the Long-Range Planning Team with a termination date of 31 December 2027.
- The quote from Haverty's for library furniture in a not-to-exceed amount of \$9,000 was approved.
- The quote in the amount of \$2,800 from BFPE for upgrade of one kitchen fire suppression system protecting one exhaust hood and one range in the McSwain Center. Also approved was a not-to-exceed \$1,000 for electrical work associated with the fire suppression system upgrade.
- The \$2,800 approved for the fire suppression system upgrade will be paid for using the Contingency Fund.
- The request of Pastor Robert Shivers to allot \$2,500 from his next six month's salary to his housing allowance.
- The proposal from Landscapes Unlimited on an annual basis be approved for \$9,876.80.
- The proposal from Cohan Contracting, LLC's for \$850 to demo cabinets in kitchen area, move refrigerator, repair holes and paint wall was approved.
- A not-to-exceed amount of \$8,000 to purchase new furniture for the renovated finance office.
- The credit card limit with First Bank was increased from \$15,000 to \$17,500 and add Pastor Robert as a user.
- A not-to-exceed amount of \$3,000 to purchase new furniture for the renovated music room.
